Diku – a national centre of competence



- Diku promotes internationalisation, intercultural dialogue and international mobility at all levels of education and coordinate efforts on national level in line with national policies
- Diku is Norway's agency for international programmes and measures related to education
- Diku provides analysis, advisory services and information (centre of competence for the ed. sector and authorities)
- Diku is responsible for promoting Norway as an attractive destination for studies and collaboration in education

Norway – country facts I

Diku

• Size: 385 000 Km²

• Population: 5,3 million (2017)

Languages: Norwegian and Sami

Currency: Norwegian kroner (NOK), (NOK/€≈10/1)

- 12 county regions/356 municipalities (from 2020)
- Elections: every 4 years
- Prime minister (since 2013):
 - Erna Solberg
 - Conservative/right wing government

- Constitutional monarchy (since 1905):
 - King Harald V
- Sovereign state since 872
 - In union with Denmark 1397 1814
 - In union with Sweden 1814 1905



- Extensive Nordic cooperation
- Member of EFTA, associated with EU (EEA area).
- Member of NATO






Norwegian educational system
