

The ERC Mentoring Initiative: What?



Problem identified:

some research agencies and host institutions in low performing countries have established programmes to support prospective ERC applicants <u>at national or regional level.</u>

These programmes struggle to identify international experts to provide coaching and advise.

Chosen approach:

ERC puts in contact national and regional programmes with ERC grantees and former panel members, interested in being mentors.

Objective:

Increase ERC applications and success rate in the selected 'low performing countries'.



The ERC Mentoring Initiative: Why?



- Give an extra push to programmes that are already in place, to enhance ERC value added and show impact.
- Targeted intervention to make best use of ERCEA resources: we should not substitute governments' policies
- Possible demonstration effect: other 'low-performing countries' may wish to establish similar national/regional support offices in the future.



ERC Mentoring Initiative (MI)



The ERC Scientific Council approved the new **Mentoring Initiative (MI)** proposed by the Working Group on Widening European Participation, in response to discussions of **last year Final Panel Chair Meeting break-out sessions on Widening participation**.

The aim of this initiative is <u>supporting ERC applicants</u> from 'low performing countries', inspired by the experience of some research agencies and host institutions which put in place programmes to support ERC applicant, but **struggle** to identify international experts to provide coaching and advise.



ERC MI General Guidelines



The local offices in charge of the Mentoring Initiative should coordinate the activities with the NCPs and NCPs will serve as the primary contact to ERC regarding the Mentoring Initiative.

National/regional authorities are envisaged to participate. The programme is not intended to serve individual research organizations.

The local offices should serve a pool of ERC applicants PIs at pre-submission stage already pre-selected by the host research organizations on the basis of their track record and draft proposal, showing clear potential for success in the competition for ERC grants.



ERC MI General Guidelines





The local offices should specify the expected workload (and potential compensations) of the external mentors. ERCEA will not compensate the mentors and any costs linked to this initiative.

It is understood that mentors on the list provided by ERC only agree to be contacted by the local offices. The presence on the ERC's Mentoring Initiative list is not a commitment to participate in a given local program.

The ERC Mentoring Initiative has to be fully in line with the ERC's rules of conflicts of interest excluding, e.g., active panel members from participating in the Initiative. Mentors should be informed clearly about the fact that ERC conflict of interest rules and code of conduct for any ERC independent experts will apply.



ERC MI procedures



European Research Council Established by the European Commission

ERC

publically announces the MI and contacts selected NCPs based strategic considerations.

NCPs

Local Offices on MI

Local Offices

serve a pool of applicants ERC pre-selected host research organizations.

NCPs

communicate Offices Local to ERC.

ERC

approves the MIs considered eligible according to the General Guidelines formulated by the Council.

ERC

launches a call for **Expression** of Interest to ERC grantees and former panel members.

ERC Pls & former PMs

expresses interest serve external mentors for local offices.

ERC

sends the list of interested grantees and former PMs to the NCPs/Local Offices.


Local Offices

nation-wide. selected preparing an ERC proposal.

ERC PIs & former PMs

provide scientific feedback proposals selected or mock interviews applicants before submission.













ERCEA support



- Identify ERC PIs and former PMs who could serve as external mentors to help national programmes and provide general info.
- Communicate to local offices through NCPs.
- Communicate feedback and proposals to ERC Scientific Council.
- Monitoring of the mentoring activities.



Proposals submission



- Provided support to NCPs working on offices identification.
- We received several proposals (the deadline for submission was the 23rd of April).

 We transmitted these applications to the ERC Scientific Council, which assessed, discussed and approved the eligible initiatives.



Next steps



- Selection of eligible ERC PIs and PMs
- Launch of the call for expression of interested, contacting the selected potential mentors by email and asking them to respond to the survey
- Transmission of the potential mentors' lists to the NCPs
- Feedback collection and adjustment after this 'pilot' initiative, in terms of procedures, implementation and timeframe
