University College, also known as Univ, is the University of Oxford's oldest college. With a long and proud history, our students today enjoy a rich and diverse experience at University College – or 'Univ' as it is known. This includes our international community with overseas students making up over a third of our student body.

The Dr Andrei Klein Czech Scholarship is a wonderful opportunity for academically gifted students from the Czech Republic to join Univ's vibrant student community.

The Klein Czech Scholarship is designed to give support to the most academically able and creative students living in the Czech Republic, who aspire to study at the University of Oxford. The aim of the scholarship is to ensure that Czech citizens with academic potential are financially supported during their studies. The Scholarship will provide significant financial assistance with the cost of living and study in Oxford.

University College Oxford

Founded in 1249 Univ has around 405 undergraduates and approximately 267 graduate students, from around 50 countries. Univ is known as a friendly College where students are encouraged to maximise their potential and test new ideas through debate and discussion. Many Univ graduates have found success and have made a difference in their communities including former Presidents and Prime Ministers, writers, poets, journalists, and renowned scientists.

Dr Pavel Klein

Dr Pavel Klein, who was born in the former Czechoslovakia and earned his degree in Medicine at Univ, established the Klein Czech Scholarship in memory of his late father Dr Andrei Klein. Dr Andrei Klein survived the concentration camps of the Nazi occupation during the Second World War and went on to become a successful doctor. He later emigrated to Great Britain in 1968, after the Soviet occupation of Czechoslovakia. Dr Pavel Klein recalled, "I feel very lucky in having been able to spend my formative years at University College and Oxford. Going there changed my life; I hope the scholarship will allow others to have a similarly rich experience. My years there were a magical experience. I owe a large debt to my father and I hope that the Scholarship will keep his memory alive by offering to others what he was unable to experience himself."

Dr Andrei Klein Czech Scholarship

Open to students who are ordinarily resident in the Czech Republic, students will be selected according to the College and University's usual academic criteria. There is no separate application process for the Dr Andrei Klein Scholarship. Students apply to the University of Oxford and the College. Students are eligible for the Scholarship only after they have successfully completed the College and University's admissions process.

Students with demonstrated financial need will be accorded preference in the awarding of the Scholarship. We want outstanding students to have the opportunity to study at Univ and Oxford. We do not want lack of finances to be a barrier.

Applying for the Scholarship

For generations, students from the former Czechoslovakia and Czech Republic have studied at Oxford and at Univ. Each year, approximately 20 students from the Czech Republic will be given a place at the University. These students are pursuing a wide variety of courses and are active members of the University of Oxford.
